

Introducing Dreamweaver

CASE 1: Use Dreamweaver to complete the following steps:

- a) Define a new site named `Almonds` in a folder named `Almonds`.
- b) Add two Web page documents to the `Almonds` Web site naming them `index.htm` and `almonds.htm`
- c) Modify the `index.htm` Web page document as follows:
 1. Change the page title to: `Almonds Home Page`
 2. Add a table with 3 rows and 1 column, a width of 95%, a border of 1, a cell padding of 5, and no cell spacing.
 3. Add content as shown below. Allow the text to wrap and replace `Student Name` with your name:

 1. Change the page title to: `Almonds`
 2. Add a table with 3 rows and 1 column, a width of 95%, a border of 1, a cell padding of 5, and no cell spacing.
 3. Add content as shown below:

CASE 2: Use Dreamweaver to complete the following steps:

- a) Define a new site named `Tiger` in a folder named `Tiger`.
- b) Add two Web page documents to the Tiger Web site naming them `index.htm` and `tiger.htm`
- c) Modify the `index.htm` Web page document as follows:
 1. Change the page title to: `Chinese Zodiac`
 2. Add a table with 3 rows and 1 column, a width of 95%, no border, a cell padding of 8, and no cell spacing.
 3. Add content as shown below. Allow the text to wrap and replace `Student Name` with your name:

- d) Modify the `tiger.htm` Web page document as follows:
1. Change the page title to: `The Tiger`
 2. Add a table with 4 rows and 2 columns, a width of 95%, a border of 1, a cell padding of 8, and no cell spacing.
 3. Set the width of the left cell in the third row to 30% and set the width of the right cell in the third row to 70%.
 4. Add content as shown below:
